TWO LIGHTHOUSES: PORTLAND HEAD LIGHT & SPRING POINT LEDGE

Seasonal (March to October)

MORNING

Begin your day in the Old Port. Stop into the now famous **Holy Donut** where they make donuts from scratch using Maine potatoes.

MIDDAY

Drive to Cape Elizabeth and visit Maine's oldest and most photographed lighthouse, **Portland Head Light**, situated in Fort Williams Park along the rocky coast. There's a children's garden, hiking trails, and small beach.

Or take a lighthouse cruise with **Portland Discovery Land & Sea Tours**.

Treat yourself to lunch at **The Lobster Shack at Two Lights**. This local landmark has been serving up fresh seafood since 1920.

Go to the **Spring Point Ledge Lighthouse**, the only caisson-style lighthouse in the U.S. that visitors can walk out to.

EVENING

Stay at the **Inn by the Sea**. Be sure to check out their lodging packages from spa treatments to foodie tours to lobster dinners!
