The menu is diverse and offers options for every palate and features from-scratch dishes and treats. They butcher their own hogs, ensuring every bite of bacon, ham, and sausage is imbued with flavor.

You can savor the tender ham alongside a perfectly golden brown butter waffle drizzled with rich Maine maple syrup.



If you prefer, you can start your day with a breakfast burrito, or a hearty plate of eggs, biscuits, and savory sausage.

Victoria's pastry skills are exceptional. The Tiny Debra's - two soft oatmeal cookies filled with a delicate buttercream and studded with dried fruit, are a must-try. These nostalgic treats are the perfect sweet ending to any meal.

You can also try the house brioche donuts. Get the classic jam-filled variety or the decadent chocolate ganache glazed with coffee custard filling. For a truly special treat, indulge in Victoria's exquisite quince tarts. The elegantly fanned poached quince sits atop a brown sugar crumble. It is as visually stunning as it is delicious.

Pro Move: For brunch, split the farro salad with sweet potato puree, roasted root vegetables, and goat cheese, alongside an F.K.F.C. – a sweet and spicy fried chicken biscuit with house pickles and cured yolk mayo. It is a flavor sensation.

The Couch Surfer

In a mixer pour:

- 1 oz. Camarena Silver Tequila
- 1 oz. Banhez Mezcal
- 1/4 oz. Pierre Ferrand Dry Curaçao
- 1/2 oz. Fresh Lime Juice
- 1/4 oz. Fresh Lemon Juice
- 1/4 oz. Simple Syrup

Add ice + shake vigorously. Strain into lowball glass. Top with sea foam.

SEA FOAM: Pour 500 ml fresh pineapple juice, 100 ml egg white, 2 oz. Ancho Reyes Verde Chile Poblaño Liqueur, 1 teaspoon Maldon sea salt, and ½ teaspoon citric acid and pour into an iSi whipper and charge with two NO2 cartridges. Shake vigorously in between charges and dispense over the cocktail.




Celebrate the season

the nubble light house

The need for a guiding light on the treacherous waters off York, Maine, had been recognized for decades, as far back as 1807. The rocky ledges and unpredictable currents made the area a mariner's nightmare. Finally, in 1879, construction began on a beacon of hope – the Nubble Lighthouse. Built from sturdy cast iron and lined with brick, the 41-foot tower, perched high on the rocky "Nubble" island, first shone its light on July 1st of that year, 88 feet above the sea. For over a century, dedicated keepers lived on the island, faithfully tending to the light that guided ships safely past the perilous coastline.



Their watch ended in 1987 when the light was automated, but Nubble Light's service continued. Today, it is an active navigational aid maintained by the U.S. Coast Guard and one of the most beloved and photographed lighthouses in America.

Its classic New England charm and picturesque setting have made it an iconic landmark, even earning a place on the Voyager Golden Record, a message to the cosmos representing humanity. The name "Nubble" speaks to the unique, rocky formation of the island it calls home, a testament to the enduring power of nature and the ingenuity of those who built the light to tame it.




